Mike Maddalena Chicken Scratch Fly



Hook: Gamakatsu, SL 15

Thread: Flat waxed nylon, yellow

Body: Yellow Buck-tail (optional, with Yellow

saddle feathers)

Wing: Yellow Grizzly

Head: Yellow Arctic Fox over with yellow SF

flash blend

Eyes: 3-D

This fly was designed to look like a popular and successful salt water plug. It can also be used for fresh-water bass.

Glen Northup Emerger Styles



When a nymph is floating in or just below the surface, trying to emerge into a dun, it is at its most vulnerable stage. Bob Greco will demonstrate a number of different emerger styles, which can be used on any fly.

John Troiano Snowshoe Rabbit's Foot Emerger



Hook: Dry fly, sizes 14-20 Thread: 6/0 or 8/0 olive

Body: White or light green z-lon or antron Wing: Light blue dun snowshoe rabbit's hair

Snowshoe rabbit's foot floats well without dressing, The z-lon or antron creates the bubbles that usually accompany an emerging body. John has found this fly very successful in many conditions.

Hook: Sizes 12-16

Thread: Black or Brown 6/0 or 8/0

Tail: Brown hackle Fibers Body: Brown hackle Hackle: White hackle



Comparadun

Hook: Sizes12-20 Thread: 6/0 or 8/0

Tail: Hackle, or Microfibetts, split Abdomen: Superfine dubbing Wing: Coastal deer hair Thorax: Superfine dubbing
