For the past four years, Dave Pollack / Capt. Ray Stachelek and mentors from both the Connecticut/ Rhode Island Coastal Fly Fishers along with the Rhody Fly Rodders group have been facilitating this instructional program, with the aid of the US Fish & Wildlife and RIDEM.

The first two sessions are devoted strictly to tying cinder worm emergence patterns. One Saturday afternoon/evening is devoted to fishing them on Ninigret Pond. Many of you have already participated as students and/or instructors.

We are doing it again in the spring of 2013. Fly tying is scheduled on two weekday nights at the USF&W Kettle Pond Nature Center following fishing during the week of the 2nd tying class at Ninigret Refuge. We provide all necessary fly tying tools, materials, and fly rod outfits as needed.

Fly Tying: Tuesday, April 30, and Monday, May 6th

Fishing: Saturday, May 11th

Every year there is a waiting list for new students. The class enrollment is limited to 40 students. Looking for instructors, our student to teacher ratio ideally would be 3-1.
